**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 – SECTION 31(6)**

1. I am required to deposit with you, under the provisions of section 31(6) of the Highways Act 1980 the enclosed plans detailed in the attached schedule. The plans show the Ministry of Defence owned land within your county area outlined in black upon which have been marked all the ways which the Secretary of State for Defence recognises as public highways.

2. Your attention is particularly drawn to the legend on the plans. I am to confirm that the extent of the public rights recognised by the Secretary of State for Defence over each route shown on the plan is as follows :-

- a) over each route shown by a continuous purple line, the Secretary of State for Defence recognises a highway over which the public have rights of way on foot only.
- b) Over each route shown by a continuous green line, the Secretary of State for Defence recognises that the public have the following but no other rights of way, that is to say, a right of way on foot and a right of way on horseback or leading a horse, with or without a right to drive animals of any description along the highway.
- c) Over each route shown by a broken green line, the Secretary of State for Defence recognises the way to be a highway other than a footpath or bridleway used by the public mainly for the purposes for which footpaths or bridleways are used, or as a byway open to all traffic.
- d) Over each route shown by a continuous brown line, the Secretary of State for Defence recognises the route as a public road over which the public has the right to pass for all purposes with or without animals or vehicles.

3. Of the above highways, those described in sub-paragraphs a), b) and c) are more particularly described in the definitive statement prepared by the County Council. The routes indicate in sub-paragraph d) are more particularly described in detail on the Plans referred to above and attached.

4. A statutory declaration will be lodged with you shortly and then renewed from time to time as appropriate.

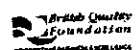

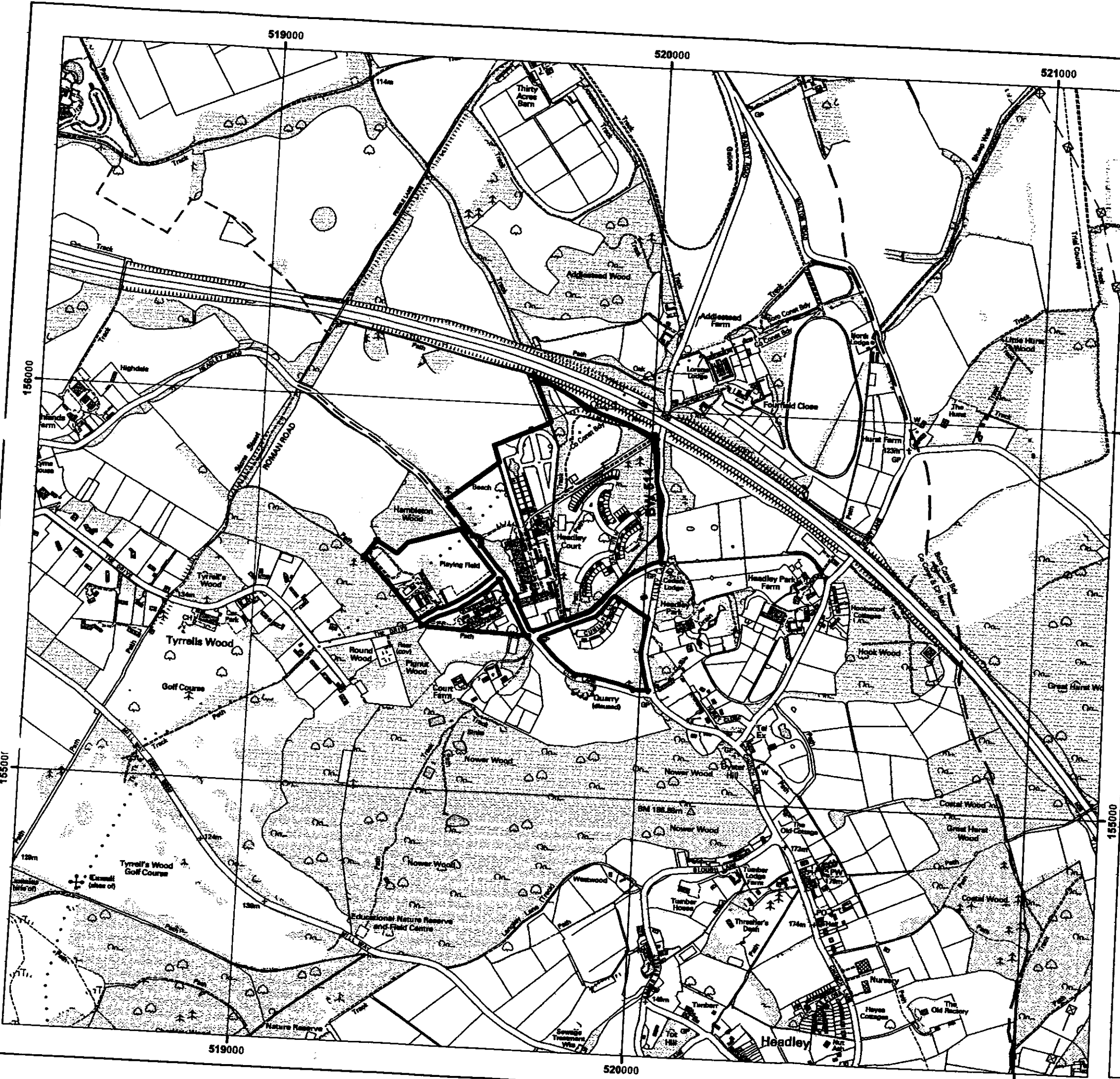
