

STATUTORY DECLARATION
SECTION 31(6) OF THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

I Mr C French of Brewerstreet Farm, Bletchingley, Redhill, Surrey, RH1 4QP


DO SOLEMNLY AND SINCERELY DECLARE as follows:

1. I am the owner of the land known as Brewerstreet Farm more particularly delineated on the map annexed to the Statement accompanying this Declaration and thereon edged red ("The Land")
2. On the 25th day of November 2009 I deposited with Surrey County Council, being the appropriate Council, a Statement and Map delineating my property in red edging which stated that the ways coloured green on the said plan have been dedicated as bridleways and the ways coloured purple on the said plan have been dedicated footpaths.
3. Additional ways have been dedicated over the land edged in red on the plan accompanying this declaration since the statement dated 25th November 2009 referred to in 2 above and are included in the highways with vehicular status, bridleways and footpaths marked in the appropriate colour on the plan accompanying this declaration, and at present time I have no intention of dedicating any more public rights of way over The Land.

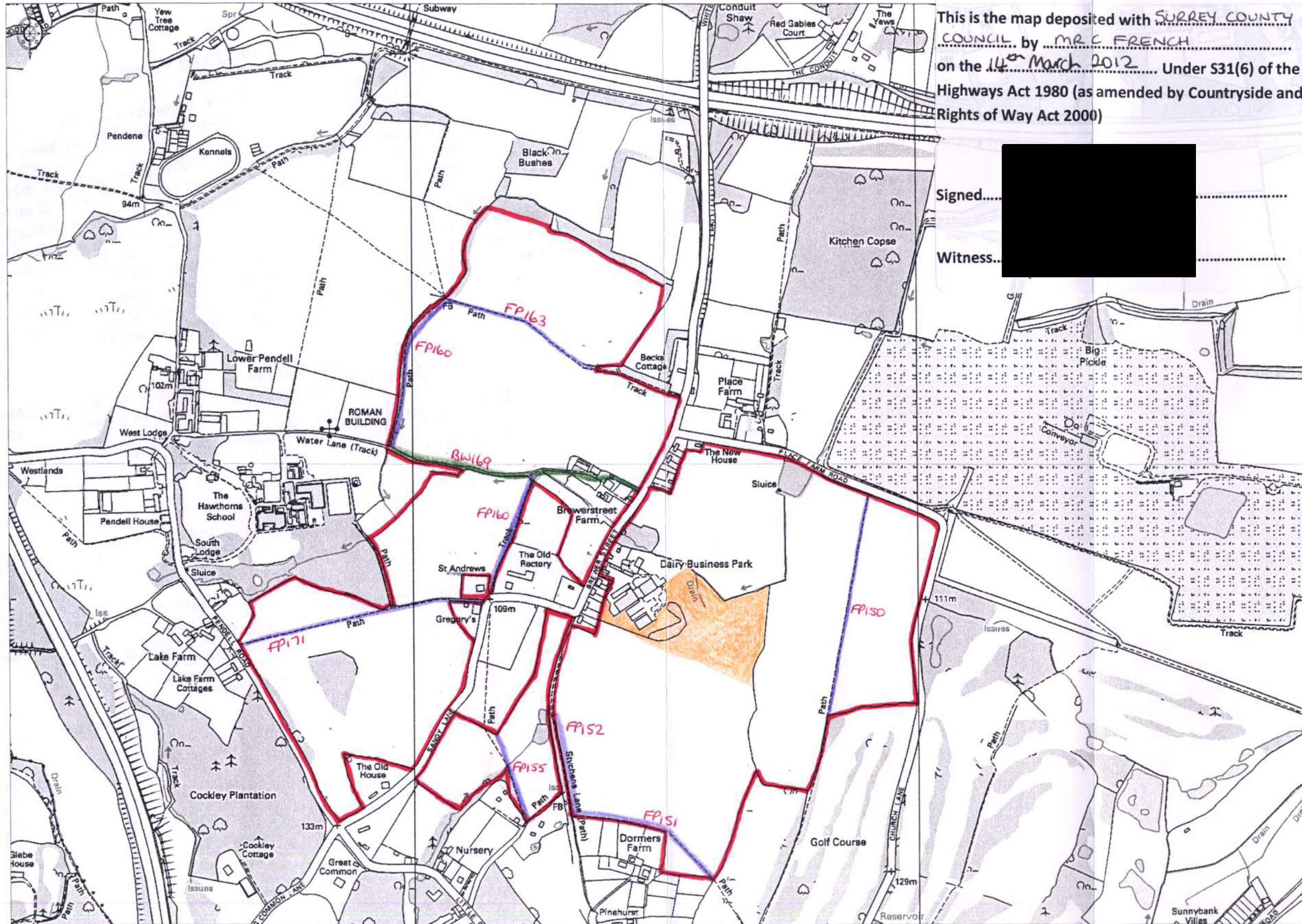
AND I MAKE this solemn declaration on the 14th day of March 2012 conscientiously believing it to be true and by virtue of the Statutory Declarations Act 1835.
