1 I am and have been since 1936 (Ockham Common and part of Wisley Common including Pond Farm), 1960 (Wisley Common) and 1965 (Chatley Heath), the owner within the meaning of the above section of the land known as Wisley & Ockham Commons and Chatley Heath more particularly delineated on the plan accompanying this statement and thereon edged red.

2 The aforementioned land lies in the Parishes/Communities of Wisley and Ockham.

* 3 The ways coloured brown on the said plan have been dedicated as highways with public vehicular status.


* 4 The ways coloured green on the said plan have been dedicated as public bridleways. * 5 The ways coloured purple on the said plan have been dedicated as public footpaths.



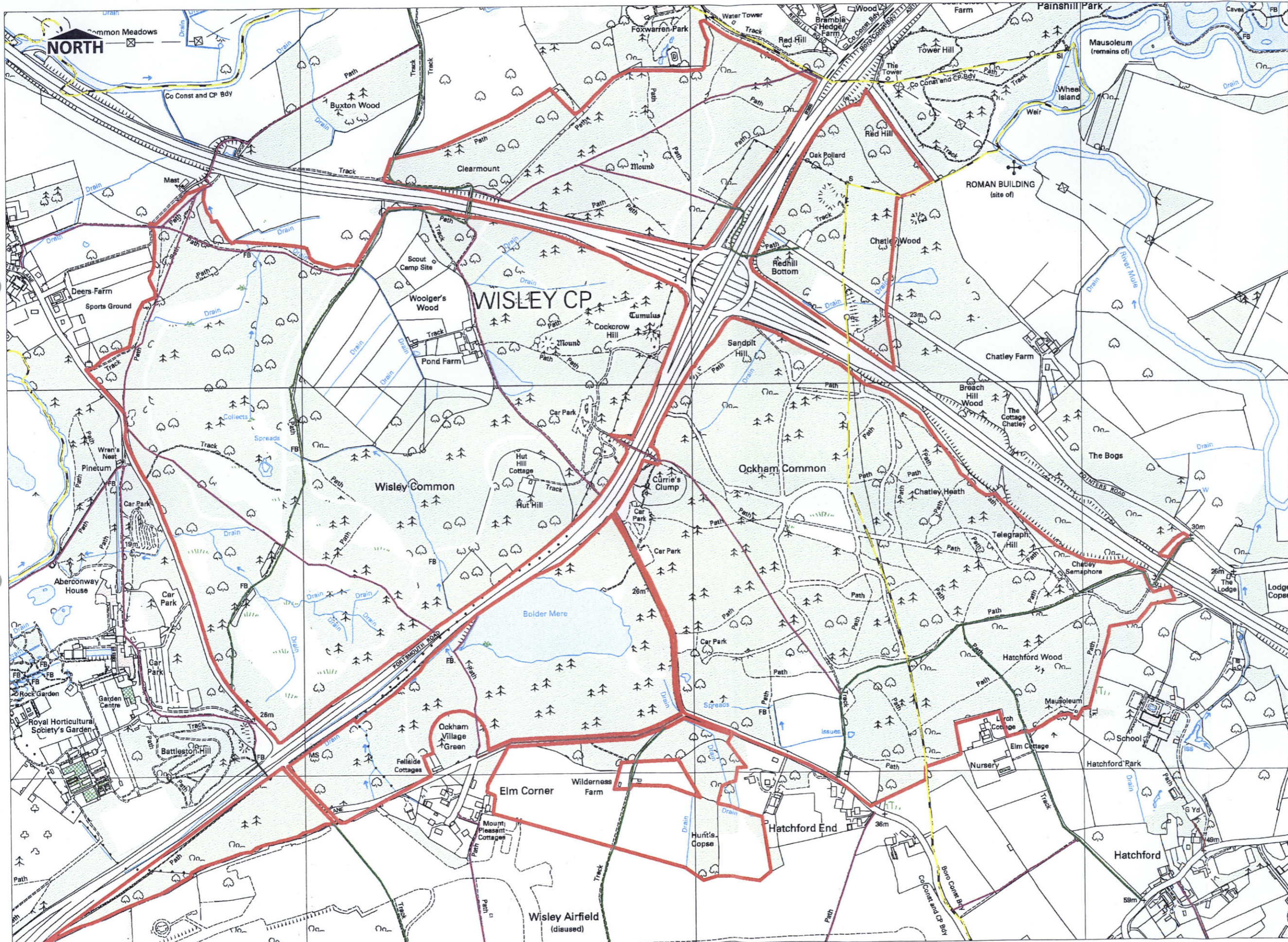
Wisley & Ockham Commons
